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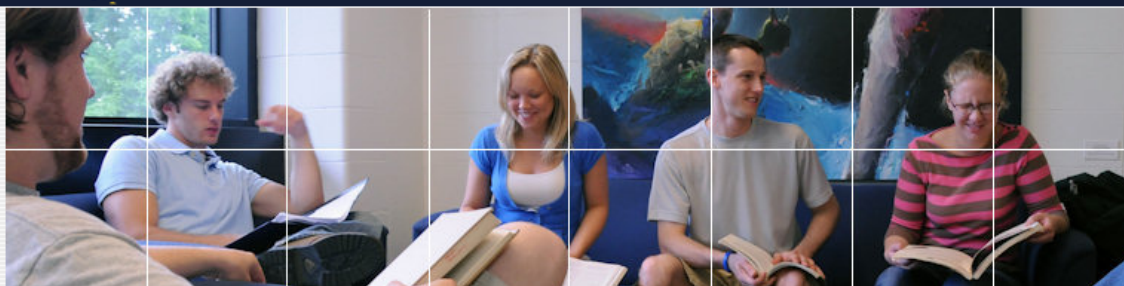

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- **University of Maine at Presque Isle: OpenU Project**

- **Purpose:** To provide college course experiences at absolutely no cost to all interested learners. This provides all community members, state- and nation-wide, with full access to live and online courses and all of their materials, including direct interaction with the instructors responsible for designing and delivering the courses.
- **Programs Involved:** English (Fall 2012), History (Spring 2013), Political Science (Spring 2013)
- **Policies:**
 - 1. All materials necessary for the course are public domain works, copyright free, or created and delivered by the instructor through Blackboard. Public domain works are available either as pdf files through Blackboard or may be downloaded as digital copies (i.e. Kindle, Nook, etc.).
 - 2. OpenU learners (defined as individuals not matriculated at UMPI) may “audit” the course free of charge and have full access to all course materials and activities.
 - 3. OpenU learners may engage in all discussion board, email, and other asynchronous or synchronous activities with enrolled learners and the instructor.
 - 4. All written or recorded lectures provided by the instructor are available to OpenU learners.
 - 5. OpenU learners may choose to complete any written assignments or examinations, but faculty are under no obligation to evaluate work. Each faculty member will provide specific expectations and guidelines for individual courses.
 - 6. A minimum of 5 such learners shall be allowed per course, with greater numbers permitted at the discretion of the instructor. OpenU learners shall not displace any matriculated students enrolled in courses at any time.
 - 7. OpenU learners will not count toward official enrollment for a course, faculty compensation, or be a determining factor in whether a course is allowed to run.
 - 8. A total of 6 credit hours from OpenU courses may be considered for prior learning credit upon application as a matriculated student at UMPI. All UMPI requirements for prior learning credit must be completed for an OpenU course to be considered for prior learning credit. Completion of an OpenU course and application for prior learning credit DO NOT guarantee credit will be granted for OpenU courses. Prior learning credit for OpenU courses may not transfer to other universities, including those of the University of Maine System.
 - 9. Learners do not receive a formal grade for an OpenU course.

- Procedures:

- 1. All OpenU Courses will be advertised on the UMPI web site and other social networking and public venues.
- 2. Prospective OpenU learners will be directed to visit Blackboard at www.courses.maine.edu and sign on as a “guest.” They will then “search” for their specific course of interest (e.g., ENG 360 “Literature of the Sea”) and may view all course documents and materials.
- 3. Individuals interested in “auditing” will then forward the following information to Registrar, including the course title and/or number: Name, date of birth, etc. Interested learners may also email instructors this information directly (who will then forward the information to Registrar).
- 4. Registrar will set up minimal demographic information in the UMPI database and inform both the instructor of the course and IT Help Desk of the auditor. IT Help Desk will “enroll” the student in the desired course.
- 5. During the add/drop period, OpenU learners may choose to enroll in the course for credit by informing either the instructor or Registrar.
- 6. The course may NOT be added for college credit following the add/drop period.
- 7. All OpenU learners are expected to follow individual course policies and protocols and may be summarily removed from the course at the request of the instructor at any time.
- 8. This OpenU agreement pertains only to non-matriculated (non-UMPI) learners.
